



The School of Architecture at The University of Arizona develops design professionals and scholars with a sensibility honed in the edge conditions of an extreme climate on a major international border. Located in the oldest continuously inhabited city in the United States, the School combines knowledge from a culturally rich history with cutting-edge research into environmental conditions and advanced material technologies in order to pursue continuing visionary exploration of the ethical, technical, and social responsibilities of reflective professional practice in the contemporary world. The School currently offers an accredited B.Arch. degree and a post-professional M.Arch. degree, and is in the process of implementing an additional new accredited M.Arch degree program. At a time of considerable change for the School and the University, successful candidates will have the opportunity to play a major role in re-shaping architectural education in Arizona.

The School invites applications for three tenure-track positions. All tenure-track positions entail responsibilities in research, teaching (including curriculum development of required and elective courses/laboratories in the fields indicated below), and service.

Sustainable Building Technologies: 2 Assistant Professors. Successful candidates must be qualified to teach courses in sustainable building technologies. One position centers on **active environmental control systems**. The other position centers on **architectural structural systems**. Candidates should specify their area(s) of interest and expertise.

Requirements: Master of Architecture and professional registration.

Desirable qualifications: LEED certification (for active environmental control position), evidence of substantial practice and/or published scholarship, and teaching experience. Ability to teach architectural design studios and/or other building technology courses.

Critical Practice and Design Studio: 1 Assistant or Associate Professor. Candidates must be accomplished, registered architects with a substantial body of built work.

Requirements: Master of Architecture, professional license, and significant experience in practice, including programming, contract documents, code review, and specification writing.

Desirable qualifications: Teaching experience.

The School is seeking individuals who are able to work with diverse students and colleagues, and who have experience with a variety of teaching methods and curricular perspectives. Qualified applicants must complete the online faculty application at www.hr.arizona.edu (U of A Jobs, citing job 43416). Be prepared to attach a full curriculum vitae and letter of interest, including statements of pedagogical and research objectives. Include contact information for three referees (with phone/fax numbers, mailing and e-mail addresses) in the application.
